Engage Miami is seeking Civics305 Spring Fellows to help us in engaging, educating, and activating students around civic participation, local elections, and government. This is a paid fellowship in which Engage Miami will provide training, mentorship, and support towards becoming a force of change in your community.

Engage Miami takes down barriers and builds bridges to equitable civic leadership through voter registration, civic education, and organizing campaigns on the issues that matter to young people in Miami. Our mission is to build a more just, democratic, and sustainable Miami by developing a local culture of civic participation for young people that is bold, creative, and impactful. We build political power for young people in South Florida to make sure the future is better for everyone.

Civics305 Fellows will lead in civic and voter engagement efforts on campuses and in communities by:

- Engaging faculty to promote civic leadership in their classrooms and educating peers through class presentations and workshops on civic engagement and why it matters for all of us in Miami-Dade
- Leading in the 100 Voter Challenge to register and pledge voters on and off-campus
- Participating in Civics305 In Focus listening circles to research and deepen understanding of the civic experiences, education, and engagement of young people in Miami-Dade
- Researching and sharing with others how local government and elections work and how to make positive changes happen, including attending local meetings and getting to know local elected officials
- Working with Engage staff using digital engagement to spread the knowledge and inspiration we need to be even more powerful civic leaders in our communities

Timeline: Three-month fellowship, start date February 8th. 8-10 hours per week.

Hourly rate: \$12.50/hour

Priority Deadline for Spring Fellowship: January 15th, 2021

- Available for at least 10 hours weekly
- Willing to give 5-10 min class presentations on civic engagement (training will be provided)

- Strong fit for students interested in politics, education, research, and community engagement
