## 3 Ways to Vote: What's Your Plan?

Make your plan to vote now, and bring your friends and family! Go to **engage.miami/vote** for all the details on what to expect as you cast your ballot, and to sign up to vote by mail.

#### **OPTION 1: VOTE-BY-MAIL - A.S.A.P.**

You can request a vote-by-mail ballot now up until 10 days before the election, but return it asap. Mail ballots are counted as soon as they are received and you can track it online. It must arrive to be counted by 7 pm on Election Day, so don't delay. Be sure to sign your ballot, remember postage is prepaid in Miami-Dade, and that drop off boxes are available.

#### **OPTION 2: VOTE EARLY - OCT. 19 - NOV. 1**

There are 33 early voting sites open from 7 am to 7 pm including MDC North, MDC Kendall and FIU - you can vote or drop your vote-by-mail ballot off at any early voting site.

#### **OPTION 3: VOTE ON ELECTION DAY, NOV. 3**

On 11/3 you must vote at your assigned precinct 7 am- 7 pm.

Call 866-OUR-VOTE to report any issues while voting.



## **Amendment 1**

This amendment states that only United States Citizens who are at least eighteen years of age, a permanent resident of Florida, and registered to vote, as provided by law, shall be qualified to vote in a Florida election.

#### **ENGAGE MIAMI RECOMMENDS: VOTE NO**

In Florida you already must be a citizen to register to vote according to state law. In some cities and towns in other states, non-citizens can vote in local elections and other cities are considering allowing voting from age 16+. **Vote No.** 

## **Amendment 2**

Raises minimum wage to \$10.00 per hour effective September 30th, 2021. Each September 30th thereafter, minimum wage shall increase by \$1.00 per hour until the minimum wage reached \$15.00 per hour on September 30th, 2026. From that point forward, future minimum wage increase shall revert to being adjusted annually for inflation starting September 30th, 2027.

#### **ENGAGE MIAMI RECOMMENDS: VOTE YES**

This amendment would help Floridians be better able to make ends meet. Those earning less than \$15 per hour are disproportionately young and people of color. **Vote Yes!** 

## **Amendment 3**

Allows all registered voters to vote in primaries for state legislature, governor, and cabinet regardless of political party affiliation. All candidates for an office, including party nominated candidates, appear on the same primary ballot. Two highest vote getters advance to general election. If only two candidates qualify, no primary is held and winner is determined in general elections. Candidate's party affiliation may appear on ballot as provided by law. Effective Jan 1, 2024.

#### **ENGAGE MIAMI RECOMMENDS: VOTE NO**

This amendment would create 'jungle primaries' which could result in elections without representation from multiple parties. BIPOC representation would decrease. **Vote No.** 

## **Amendment 4**

Requires all proposed amendments or revisions to the state constitution to be approved by the voters in two elections, instead of one, in order to take effect. The proposal applies the current thresholds for passage to each of the two elections.

#### **ENGAGE MIAMI RECOMMENDS: VOTE NO**

This amendment would make it twice as hard to pass citizenled amendments, creating barriers to democracy. **Vote No.**
