Make Your Plan to Vote.

Vote by Mail

You can request your Vote-by-Mail ballot online, in person, via email, or by phone call up to 10 days before any election. We recommend submitting your request as early as possible to avoid any delays. Once you submit your request and return your mail-in ballot, you can track your ballot online.

Election Day

On Tuesday, November 8, you must vote at your assigned polling location from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m. If you're in line at 7 p.m., you have a right to cast your ballot.



Bring a form of ID that includes your name, picture, and signature to vote early or on Election Day!

Early Voting

You can vote at any early voting site from October 24 to November 6 from 7:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m.

What's in this Voter Guide?


Research is based on publicly available candidate statements, articles and interviews, voting history, and campaign websites as of September 26.

Candidates for Governor of Florida, U.S. Senator, U.S. Congressional Representative for Districts 27 and 28, and Florida Senate Districts 36 and 38 are included in this voter guide. We indicate whether the candidate:

- •Supports protection of abortion rights in Florida
- Supports banning assault weapons and increasing background checks for gun purchases
- Supports a rapid transition to clean energy including cutting carbon emissions and use of fossil fuels
- •Stands up for LGBTQ rights, such as speaking out against the "Don't Say Gay" bill and strengthening LGBTQ protections through the Equality Act
- •Supports humane immigration policies such as caring for unaccompanied children, sanctuary for migrants, and a path to citizenship for DACA and TPS recipients
- Supports strengthening voting rights, such as voting rights restoration and the John Lewis Voting Rights Act
- Supported the Inflation Reduction Act which lowers prescription drug prices and extends subsidies for healthcare coverage
